Session One

April 28, 2017

Delivering Comprehensive Case Presentations

Fabricating a treatment plan is not always the problem, getting the patient to accept it, and fit it, within their specific limitations, is often the challenge. There is a synchronized method and philosophy on how to gather both clinical and non-clinical information necessary to develop a patient specific comprehensive treatment plan to achieve greater case acceptance.

Goals and objectives:

- Review how to work up a patient specific case
- Review how to develop a comprehensive treatment plan and present that treatment plan to the patient
- Understand the homework which is comprised of treatment planning guidelines for presentation in sessions 2 & 3

Session Three

Treatment Planning the Edentulous Patient—Mandible and Maxilla Options

Many options are available to the surgeon and restorative dentist to provide full arch dental implant therapy to patients with a failed dentition. Taking the patients long term prognosis into account can determine the treatment. The goal is to restore the patient with a long-term predictable, functional and aesthetic restoration. *A treatment planning session will accompany the lecture so please plan to bring cases with you for treatment planning. These cases should be focused on the failing and/or failing dentition.

Goals and objectives:

- To learn how to treatment plan a patient with a failed dentition
- To determine the best course of treatment for a patient's individual needs
- To understand the short and long term options available for treatment

Session Four

December 8, 2017

Immediate Temporization of Dental Implants

Proper diagnosis and treatment planning is essential for success. Topics such as pre-surgical planning, abutment and material selection, fabrication of provisional restorations, tissue sculpting and immediate provisional restoration will be covered in this course.

Goals and objectives:

- To recognize the challenges with implants as it relates to aesthetics, provisionalization and tissue
- To recognize and understand complications for the dental implant patient
- To learn how to maintain a patient after dental implant therapy from an occlusion and hygiene standpoint
- To learn about techniques and materials used for the fabrication of provisional restorations
