Guest Speaker:
Dr. Gary Morris, DDS

Dr. Morris received his doctor of dental surgery from the University of Illinois at Chicago and completed his residency in Prosthodontics at the UMKC College of Dentistry in Kansas City Missouri. He is an Adjunct Clinical Assistant Professor at Southern Illinois University, School of Dental Medicine where he sat on the committee that formed the SIU Dental Implant Center at its inception. Prior to this appointment he was a Clinical Assistant Professor at the University of Illinois, College of Dentistry. Dr. Morris has lectured extensively both nationally and internationally on implant prosthodontics and has authored or co-authored numerous articles and two book chapters related to dental implants. Dr. Morris sits on clinical advisory boards for several industry leaders and is the Director of Education for Dental CE Solutions, Ltd. He maintains a private practice, limited to prosthodontics and restorative dentistry, in Buffalo Grove, Illinois.

Session #1 Immediate Tooth Replacement Therapy

In a world where everything is driven towards consolidation and efficiency, immediate tooth replacement therapy with dental implants is a hot topic of conversation. But when and how do we accomplish this therapy? And is there a difference between ITRT in the anterior vs. posterior jaw? This course will define a protocol for immediate tooth replacement therapy and make recommendations as to when and where it is appropriate.

Objectives:

- To understand when a tooth can be extracted and replaced immediately.
- To understand how to provide this care in the anterior and posterior.
- To be able to choose which type of temporary restorations can be used for ITRT.
- To be able to describe after care for implants during the first 3 months after placement.

Session #2 Three Visit Full Arch Therapy

Once full arch implant restorations are ready for completion of care, how many appointments should it take to finish. There are several answers to this question. Newer digital workflows allow for consolidation of appointments and often these restorations can be completed in three visits after surgical release. This course will outline procedures and workflows that will increase accuracy and efficiency.

Objectives:

- To understand the steps needed to complete full arch implant retained restorations.
- To understand how to communicate with the lab.
- To be able to choose which type of restoration should be fabricated and which materials to use.
- To be able to describe when not to use three visit therapy.

Session #3 Maintenance of Proper Diagnostic Records

As we transition in dentistry to a more efficient and digital workflow, what records should we keep and how do we store them? This is a common conundrum amongst dentists and there is little agreement on what we should be collecting. This course will compare and contrast the consultation process and collection of records for treatment planning and risk management purposes.

Objectives:

- To understand when digital records should be taken and how to store them.
- To understand when analog records are more useful than a digital approach.
- To be able to choose what type of temporary restorations a patient will need and what type of records will be beneficial in the manufacturing of these provisional prostheses.

Session #4 Grand Rounds

How do you deliver a proper treatment plan to the patient? What should you say? This course will discuss scripts for successful treatment plan presentation and patient education. Cases will be presented to the group for treatment planning and mock case presentations.

Objectives:

- To be able to create a treatment presentation.
- To accurately communicate the need for care and present the case to the patient in a way that is understandable.



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
