Comprehensive treatment planning can provide clinicians with insight into immediate and future issues. By identifying patient issues and concerns, a plan can be made for the potential immediate, provisional restoration for a patient. Implant Maintenance

Complications are issues that cannot be foreseen when treatment planning, they can be inherited issues that a previous clinician did not resolve or something that was not noticed at the time of treatment. The ability to recognize, communicate and treat these issues is crucial. Peri-implantitis is one of the complications that can cause the failure of implants. We will discuss the incidence, prevalence and etiology of peri-implantitis as well as the diagnosis, prevention and treatment.
